# Hebrew Words for Rosh HaShanah

אֶלוּל	Elul	A <b>month</b> in the Jewish calendar. Rosh HaShanah preparations begin in the month of Elul.
סְלִיחוֹת	Selichot	<b>Special prayers</b> said before Rosh HaShanah usually on the Saturday night before Rosh HaShanah.
שׁוֹפָר	Shofar	A <b>rams horn</b> blown in the synagogue on Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur. Its sound calls to Jews to reflect, repent and pray.
תְּשׁוּבָה	Teshuvah	Means <b>repentance</b> . Recognition of one's faults, weaknesses and failures and to reflect and repair these.
תְּפִלָּה	Tefilah	Means <b>Prayer</b> . It is a mitzvah on Rosh HaShanah.
צְדָקָה	Tzedakah	Means <b>Charity</b> . It is a mitzvah on Rosh HaShanah to give to the needy and share with others.
לָשׁוּב	Lashuv	To turn or return to G-d.
שִׂמְחָה	Simchah	Means <b>joy</b> . It is custom to visit friends and relatives and is part of the joy of Rosh HaShanah.
הַבְּדֵלָה	Havdalah	At the end of Rosh HaShanah is a mitzvah to recite the Havdalah.
קִדּוּשׁ	Kiddush	<b>Blessing over wine.</b>

# Hebrew Words for Rosh HaShanah

הַמוֹצֵיאַ	Hamotsi	Blessing over the Challah for Rosh Hashana.
רֵאשׁ הַשָּׁנָה	Rosh HaShanah	Takes place on the 1 <sup>st</sup> of Tishri. It is the ten days of inner reflection. It is a High Holy Day. The period from Rosh Hashanah to Yom Kippur is known as Yom Nora-im.
יוֹם הַזְּכוֹרוֹן	Yom Hazikaron	The Day of Remembrance. It is the day we remember all of our past deeds for the year.
יוֹם תְּרוּעָה	Yom Truah	The Day of Blowing the Shofar. The rams horn and is blown to stir our hearts to repent.
יוֹם הַדִּין	Yom Hadin	The Day of Judgement. Our good deeds are weighed and it calls for confession of our sins and prayers of forgiveness.
